



Sample Lesson Plan Climate Quilt



Aim – to have students complete a quilt square with their pledge, name, address and suburb.

Subject areas – literacy (spelling, grammar), science, environmental science, design and creativity.

Whole Class Introduction

1. Discuss climate quilt project.
2. Discuss problems we know exist with the environment and climate change.
3. Discuss the meaning of a pledge.
4. Brainstorm ways in which we as individuals can help.



Independent Work

1. Students write a draft of their pledge on a piece of paper to have be corrected by the teacher.
2. Measure and cut out 6.5 cm (16.5cm) squares of fabric (for upper students only). Masking tape fabric squares to recycled cardboard to anchor them and prevent students from writing too close to the edge.
3. Using fabric markers, write pledge.
4. Add name, age and town (suburb).
5. Decorate.

Whole Class Sharing

1. Students show and share pledges.
2. Discuss the impact students think the quilt and their pledges may have.
3. After patches have been sew together, show and students their work and celebrate work.
